1 Summary

- 1.1 A paper is included on Part 2 of the agenda, which contains exempt supplemental information. The information is exempt by virtue of paragraph 3 of Schedule 12A of the Local Government Act 1972 in that it contains information relating to the financial affairs of a person or authority. - 2.1 **The Committee is asked to note the paper and the supplemental information on Part 2 of the agenda and to consider a base salary increase, with effect from 1 April 2015.**

3 Background

Market Benchmarking

- 3.1 On 19 March 2015, the Committee discussed the 2015 bespoke market benchmarking review for the Commissioner and Chief Officer roles undertaken by the external remuneration advisors, New Bridge Street (part of Aon Hewitt).
- 3.2 At the request of the Committee, the composition of the peer group for this review has included significantly more public sector facing organisations. The 'Combined Comparator Group' benchmark is calculated on the basis of a 60:40 split between a Listed Companies Group, consisting of a bespoke selection of large transport and infrastructure companies and a Publicly Accountable Group, consisting of a bespoke selection of companies accountable to the UK public, owned, or overseen by, the government, and with a degree of sensitivity around pay.
- 3.3 The detailed report by the external remuneration advisors (incorporated into the March 2015 Committee papers) indicated that the Commissioner's base salary is significantly below the median benchmarked market level.
- 3.4 Proposals will be tabled in Part 2 of the meeting, on or before the meeting.
