Surface Transport Panel: Actions Update

The Surface Transport Panel at its meeting on 15 July 2015 requested additional information on the construction phasing and associated restrictions on Power Road Bridge. This note provides the latest information on the proposed works.

Summary

The works to replace the bridge at Power Bridge Road on the A406 are on site and will run until summer 2017. The works will require two major closures of A406: a weekend closure in February 2016 and a six day closure over Christmas 2016. An extensive communications plan is in place and local councils, residents and other stakeholders will be kept informed about these works.

Details

The main project is on site at Power Road Bridge and started in early April 2015 and is due to complete by summer 2017. Currently there is a 30mph speed reduction in place throughout the works (the normal speed limit is 40mph).

In order to complete the project in its entirety, major closures/restrictions of the A406 North Circular Road will be required:

Weekend lane restrictions are required to allow the installation of the service bridge which is due to take place in February 2016 and will see the following restrictions put in to place;

- a) Northbound side will be closed completely with a contra-flow on the Southbound side (enabling two way traffic flows, of one lane in each direction);
- b) The 30mph will be enforced and a ban placed upon any wide-load (abnormal) loads;
- c) This restriction will typically be in place from Friday 2100hrs-Sun 0900hrs.

A major closure will be required for the demolition of the existing bridge and the slide in of the new bridge deck. This will be a six day total closure over Christmas 2016. These restrictions will include, but not be limited to a total closure of the A406 in both directions with traffic diverted via the A40, A312 and the A4 (and potentially for London bound traffic via the A40 West Cross Route, subject to approval. In addition, the utility works to divert services from the existing structure to the new service bridge will take place from March 2016 to December 2016. The works details are being finalised but are likely to require a number of lane closures. These closures will be kept to a minimum.

To summarise our traffic mitigation:

- a) Advance warning signs/VMS on site;
- b) Letters going out to local public;
- c) Personalised letters/emails to local schools/Councillors etc. to notify them of likely disruption and provide contacts for the works;
- d) Project Website info to be updated;
- e) Works have been discussed/agreed with Borough Street Works Manager; and
- f) The main works are planned for a six day duration.
