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Summary

Transport Crime in London

The publication of this 2019/20 bulletin was delayed due to Covid with staff furloughed and the focus being on supporting operational priorities.

The information presented in this bulletin covers I April 2019 - 3I March 2020. The first national lockdown for the pandemic commenced on 23 March 2020, eight days before the end of the performance year. This would have had a small impact on overall crime and passenger levels reported for 2019/20.

During 2019/20, an average of eleven million passengers travelled on TfL's public transport services each day, with very few of them ever experiencing or witnessing crime. For every one million passenger journeys there were eleven reported crimes, the majority of these being theft offences.

These low levels of crime were driven by a range of initiatives undertaken by TfL in partnership with the police forces in London. TfL's significant investment in transport policing and commitment to improving safety and security ensured the system remained a low crime environment.

Despite our public transport networks remaining safe, low-crime environments we had seen an upturn in crime levels over recent years. This followed ten years of successive crime reduction and achieving record low levels of crime in 2014/15 bucking national and London-wide crime trends. The increase in crime on our networks had largely been driven by increases in theft offences and robberies, as well as making it easier to report crime.

In March 2020, the covid-19 pandemic had a direct impact on crime and passenger volumes. There was a 4I per cent decrease in passenger numbers when comparing March 2019 with March 2020 (I45m fewer journeys) and levels of crime on the network reduced by 28 per cent when comparing March 2019 with March 2020 (I,063 fewer crimes).

In 2019/20, there were 40,864 offences on TfL's public transport networks, up by 17.4 per cent compared with 2018/19 (6,058 additional offences). There were 10.7 crimes per million passenger journeys (up from 8.7 in 2018/19). The increase in the volume and rate of crime was largely driven by a rise in reported theft offences.

Theft rose by 40 per cent across our public transport networks (5,692 additional offences); this accounted for 94 per cent of the overall increase in crime for 2019/20 compared to 2018/19. Ninety-six per cent of all theft offences occur on the London Underground or bus networks. The rise in theft can in part be explained by the BTP launching their on-line crime reporting in October 2018, meaning that the BTP are now recording offences which may previously have gone unreported. Despite this, we know that our public transport networks were being targeted by prolific thieves working as part of organised criminal networks. The police were, and continue to, use a range of tactics to deter, detect and disrupt their criminal activity including plain clothes and uniformed officer patrols, large scale operations and investigations. We supported this important police effort by promoting crime prevention advice to our customers. As part of Operation Farrier, the BTP and MPS made some significant arrests that have led to notable custodial sentences.

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The level of robbery remained low across TfL's public transport networks with an average of six offences a day, or 0.6 crimes per million passenger journeys. 2019/20 saw a 28.3 per cent increase (371 more offences) in robbery offences on the bus network compared with the last year, mirroring the wider trends seen across London. The increase in robbery was largely a street robbery problem that was impacting the bus network, particularly at bus stops. This rise was being addressed through targeted police operations, including joint work with the Metropolitan Police local Borough Operational Command Units and the Metropolitan Police Violent Crime Taskforce, to target linked series offences and known violent offenders on London's streets who were also affecting the public transport network.

Measures that had been put in place to deal with the upward trend in violence / serious public order offences between passengers seen on some rail modes (LU, DLR and the LO networks) had a positive effect. The issue remained one of low-level violence, pushing and shoving, verbal disputes and threatening behaviour at busy commuter times when services were at peak capacity. Some of this violence and threatening behaviour was targeted at our staff, and those of our operators and contractors, whilst simply doing their jobs. This was, and is, unacceptable. A pan-TfL strategy has been implemented to tackle work-related violence and aggression against our people and a package of new measures being delivered that will improve the safety of our staff and customers.

Covid and associated public health measures have had an unprecedented and devastating impact on London's public transport networks which was felt throughout the 2020/2I performance year. A short annual bulletin for 2020/2I will be published in Spring.



2019/20 Crime Summary

Total Crime (by Type)



At the end of 2019/20, 40,864 crimes had been committed on TfL's public transport networks. The volume of crime was up 6,058 offences compared to end of 2018/19.

The main driver for the increase was theft offences.

Crimes per million passenger journeys




In 2019/20, the pan-modal crime rate was 10.7 crimes per million passenger journeys.

The crime rate and crime volume have increased year on year for the past 5 years (following sustained periods of decline and record low levels of crime).

This increase has predominantly been driven by a rise in theft offences.

Total Crime (by Mode)



Of the 40,864 crimes 91.5% occur on the LU or bus networks. The proportion of LU crimes has increased (from 46.3% to 50.5%) as the proportion for the bus network has reduced from 44.2% to 41.0%. All other modes have remained at a similar proportion accounting for between 7 and 10% collectively.

Comparing 2019/20 to the previous year there was a notable increase in thefts and robbery offences on the LU and bus networks.

Theft

Pan Modal

Crime Summary

There was a 40 per cent increase in theft on London's public transport networks, predominantly driven by an increase in theft on the LU network (which accounted for nearly three quarters of this increase). In 2019/20, the pan-modal crime for theft was 5.2 crimes per million passenger journeys, an increase of 1.7 on the previous financial year.

30% of theft on LU occurred during the evening peak (1700-2000) on weekdays.

13% of theft on LU occurred during the hours of Night Tube operation¹.

Theft on the bus network peaked between 18:00 and 19:00 (increasing throughout the day from the morning peak).

¹ The hours of 00:30 – 05:30, Saturday and Sunday are used for this estimate.

Violence

Crime Summary

The volume and rate of violence (including all BTP public order offences) across TfL's public transport networks have remained at a similar level to last year.


Crime Summary


In 2019/20, there was a decrease in sexual offences. There were 0.5 sexual offences reported per million passenger journeys.

The number and rate of sexual offences has declined slightly on previous years following an intense period of campaigning to improve the reporting of unwanted sexual behaviour on London's public transport networks.

The volume of sexual offences is low with one reported for every two million passenger journeys but, despite our efforts, we know that this type of crime is still underreported and there is more to do to improve victim confidence to report.



In 2019/20 there were 0.4 criminal damage offences per million passenger journeys. The crime rate had been decreasing since 2016/17 and was at its lowest rate in 2019/20.

Hate Crime

Pan Modal

Crime Summary

Hate crime is defined as any criminal offence which is perceived, by the victim or any other person, to be motivated by hostility or prejudice towards someone based on a personal characteristic. The police can flag an offence as being motivated by hate crime and as such these offences are subsets of the overall crime categories displayed in the remainder of this report.

TfL saw an increase of 4.3 per cent in reported hate crime in 2019/20 compared with previous years. A range of activity is underway to tackle hate crime and reassure those that feel vulnerable to victimisation. This includes Operation Safer Travel for All which aims to reassure customers and give them practical information about what to do should they ever experience or witness hate crime, and #WeStandTogether, a communications campaign to reassure the travelling public that the network is safe and encourage them to report issues so action can be taken. This is in addition to targeted action against offenders.

The 2019/20 rate remained relatively static compared with the previous three years. Tackling Hate crime remains a focus for TfL and its policing partners.


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London Underground (LU) Crime Summary

The London Underground network had the highest volume of crime (20,631) and highest crime rate across TfL's public transport networks. Despite this it remains a low crime environment with 15.4 crimes for every one million passenger journeys, most of which is theft offences.

In 2019/20 theft of passenger property offences accounted for 55% of all offences (compared to a low of 35% in 16/17.



Bus-related Crime Summary

In 2019/20, the bus network saw an 8.8 per cent increase (1,353 offences) and the rate of crime has increased from 6.9 to 7.9 crimes per million passenger journeys as a result. Despite this increase, the bus network had the second lowest crime rate across all TfL's public transport networks in 2019/20. (the DLR has a rate of 6.2).

The increase in the volume and rate of crime on the bus network was due to an increase in theft and robbery offences.


In 2019/20 robbery accounted for 10 per cent and theft accounted for 46 per cent of total bus-related crime.

Docklands Light Railway (DLR) Crime Summary

The DLR network has the lowest crime rate of all of TfL's public transport networks with 6.2 crimes for every one million journeys. There were an additional 40 offences in 2019/20 compared with the previous year, a 5.8 per cent increase.

Crime levels remained low on the DLR network, however there was a significant rise in robbery offences.


As it is a low crime environment and carries significantly fewer passengers, small fluctuations in crimes will change the overall rate significantly.

LO 5-year Proportion by Crime Type





TfL Rail 5-year Proportion by Crime Type




Crime levels in 2019/20 remained similar to the previous year on the TfL Rail network.

Trams Crime Summary

Levels of crime on the tram network remained very low in 2019/20 despite a 9.5 per cent increase (23 additional offences).
